NEXT year the Queen celebrates her golden jubilee, marking an incredible 50 years on the throne.

Spectacular celebrations honouring her status as figurehead and ambassador are planned across the country.

The main festivities will be in May and June 2002, with the highlight over the weekend of June 1-4.

Monday June 3 will be an extra bank holiday, and the spring bank holiday, which would otherwise fall on Monday May 27, will be moved to Tuesday June 4.

That day is Jubilee day, when the Queen will attend a national service of thanksgiving at St Paul's Cathedral, London.

Three were put in the town's All Saints' churchvard.



No doubt you will have further contact with me regarding this but I must warn you that the purchasing of suitable trees is not necessarily a simple and straightforward matter.

- Other Matters
- This hall will be available but any use will have to be paid for. The District Council considered the principle behind granting free use of such facilities but in view of the number of requests received decided with much regret, that it was not in a financial position to grant such free use. Should you specifically wish to reserve the hall for any activity payment therefore will be expected. On the other hand if it would be a matter of using the hall at the last moment i.e. without reserving it payment would only be made for actual use.
- 11. Plants
 Plants can be made available on loan by the Parks Section of my department but at a cost.
- 12. Trestle Tables
 Those tables in the Chichester Hall would be available for your use but I regret to say all the additional ones under the Council's control are now already booked out.
- 13. Flagpole An officer in the Controller's Department will be in touch with you to assist with this fitting.
- 14. Street Decorations and Granville Parade
 The appropriate action is being taken with regard to these matters, but of course
 the Council reserves the right to ensure that any street decorations are both safe
 and appropriate.
- 15. Marquee
 As stated earlier in my letter permission is granted for this marquee in the Sandgate Recreation Ground.

I very much hope that this letter clarifies the situation for you but please do not hesitate to contact me again if further assistance is required.
